

MCHS Driver Education Summer School Sessions

Summer Driver Education Classroom:

Driver education classes are available to any qualified Wake County middle and high school students. Students may take driver education at any public high school. To take driver education classes, you must live in or attend school in Wake County and must meet the following qualifications:

- Must be actively enrolled in school at the end of the current school year, (public, private or home school).
- Must be at least 14 ½ years old by the first day of class you select.
- Have never taken Driver Education before.

Classes will meet in room 2100 from 8:00 AM to 2:30 PM daily as scheduled. .Students MUST attend every class session in order to pass class. (No Makeup).

Summer Regulations:

1. You must attend the first day and if you miss more than 4 hours of class instruction, you will be dropped from the class and will not be able to take Driver Education through the school system again
2. You are expected to follow the WCP guidelines. Failure to comply with these guidelines will result in removal from the class. Any student removed for disciplinary reasons may not take Driver Education through the school system again.
3. You should bring pen, pencils, paper, and a copy of your birth certificate, a bag lunch and a drink to class each session.
4. You must provide your own transportation to and from class.
5. Any registration forms received after April 28th will go to a waiting list (if all classes are filled). We will offer you the first available class for which you are eligible.

Summer Classroom Registration:

Registration for Wake County Driver Education summer classes will begin at Middle Creek on Tuesday April 1, 2008. It is very important that you register as soon as possible to get the class you want during the summer sessions. Registration forms are available at Guidance or you may visit www.jordandriving.com for a printable form. All Wake County High School classes and locations offered during the summer are located on the back of the registration forms. Please turn in (legible in black or blue ink) completed registration forms to Guidance. Listed are the registration time lines:

- **Priority Registration is April 1st through April 28th.** This includes all Middle Creek students and any other qualified Wake County student that want to take class here at MCHS or at another Wake County High School. Lead teachers must have these forms to exchange with other schools at our April 30th meeting. Students will be assigned to each class by age, oldest to youngest. Please provide a 1st and 2nd choice on the form.

- **Registration forms turned in after April 28th** will be assigned to class on a first come, first serve basis of slots available until the class is full. Any student that wish to take driver education classes at another Wake County High School must send the registration form directly to the school of choice if not received by April 28th.

Middle Creek students will be notified of their class assignment by highlighted post cards mailed to the address on the registration forms from May 21st through June 5th. Once you receive notification of assigned class and you CAN NOT attend session, PLEASE call (919) 773-3884 to cancel seat assignment.

Behind the Wheel Training

Once all class room requirements are completed, students will be assigned a driving instructor to schedule your behind the wheel driving training. The behind the wheel instructor is responsible for calling and scheduling students to drive. When called please remember to write down your driving instructor's name and number, driving schedule, place to meet and to be picked up. You must provide your own transportation to and from driving sessions. **All cell phones and any other devices by students MUST BE OFF in the car during driver training. Please be patient as we attempt to drive students as quickly as possible.**

Driver Eligibility Certificate

Students are also required by the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicle and dropout prevention services to pass at least 3 of 4 classes at MCHS to obtain a Driver Eligibility Certificate. This form is needed to obtain or maintain a learner's permit or a driver license. You may take driver education without meeting the 3 of 4 passing requirement; however, you will not satisfy the driver eligibility rules until you pass 3 of 4 classes. Driver's Eligibility Certificates are validated by Joleen M. Sullivan (Registrar) at MCHS.
